
Route 9 Corridor Plan

Village of South Glens Falls and Town of Moreau, NY

BFJ was retained by the Adirondack-Glens Falls Transportation Council (A/GFTC) to develop a corridor management plan for New York State Route 9 in the Village of South Glens Falls and the Town of Moreau in Saratoga County, New York. The corridor is approximately 9 miles in length. A/GFTC is the metropolitan planning organization for the region that includes the Town of Moreau and the Village of South Glens Falls. The goal of the study was to provide a long-term vision for the corridor and to develop a list of future improvements needed to best serve the traveling public and the surrounding community.

BFJ analyzed current and predicted traffic flows, safety records, the use of all other transportation modes and the development pattern along Route 9, to identify deficiencies and issues. Two public workshops were held with all stakeholders in the corridor to understand their concerns and to obtain their input into the plan. BFJ developed short, intermediate and long-term recommendations to manage corridor traffic while considering aesthetic and economic development goals. The recommendations included measures to improve traffic flow and safety, bicycle and pedestrian improvements and suggestions for improving the bus service. BFJ also recommended changes in site plan regulations and zoning.



Five project justification reports were prepared for A/GFTC to assist in the securing of state and federal funds for the recommended improvements. These reports included an application for a modern roundabout at a key intersection and for sidewalk and bicycle improvements.
